✦ What is CO4CITIES?

CO4CITIES - Collaborative Tools for Cities in Urban Regeneration - is an Urbact project, started in March 2021, aimed to disseminate the methodology developed through the UIA CO-CITY project carried out in 2020 by the city of Turin. The partner cities are Turin (Italy), the Lead partner, Budapest (Hungary), Gdansk (Poland) and Cluj Napoca (Romania).

The main tools to be transferred regard the good practices acquired for the co-management of common goods (the pact of collaboration and the role of neighborhood houses in the process of community empowerment).

Each city is experimenting with innovative solutions through one or more pilot projects. The project involved several Urbact Local Groups, formed by experts and various stakeholders, who collaborate through periodic meetings to achieve the defined objectives and facilitate the project development.

Thanks to the ULGs, the partner cities are working on an Investment Plan that can help define the tools necessary to achieve the objectives. Turin, as Lead partner, is working on the drafting of a Springboard Plan, a strategic plan that can address the future of the urban regeneration of the city through the tools made available by the Urban Common Goods Regulations.

Over the past months, each city organized a *Transnational Meeting* - one in presence and the others online - to facilitate the transfer, which allowed the sharing of experiences and skills.
