REFERENDUMS JUNE 2005

Law 459 of 27 December 2001 containing

"Provisions governing the right to vote of Italian citizens resident abroad"

1. What is the poll about?

On **12 June 2005** voting will take place for **four referendums** concerning the repeal of some of the provisions of Law 40 of 19 February 2004 on medically assisted reproduction. The provisions in question are:

- Limits to clinical and experimental research on embryos
- Rules governing limits to access
- Rules governing objectives, the rights of the persons involved and limits to access
- Ban on heterologous fertilisation

2. Who can vote?

a. All Italian citizens resident abroad and registered in the electoral register may vote by correspondence.

3. How does voting take place?

Italian citizens living abroad may express their vote **by correspondence**, using the postal system, as envisaged by the following provisions of Law 459/2001:

- a. By **25 May** the Consular offices will send to all those voters who have not taken up the option to vote in Italy **a pack** containing:
 - their voting certificate (i.e. the document certifying their right to vote);
 - **four ballot papers** in different colours, one for each referendum;
 - **two envelopes** of different sizes;
 - the text of Law 459/2001 and the present information sheet.
- b. Voters should express their vote by **marking** each ballot paper (for example with a cross or a line) inside the rectangle continuing their chosen reply (YES or NO) **using a pen with black or blue coloured ink ONLY**.
- c. Voters should then place all four ballot papers in the smaller, blank white envelope, which should then be closed and sealed. This sealed envelope, together with the counterfoil from the voting certificate (the counterfoil should be detached from the certificate by tearing or cutting along the dotted line) should then be placed in the larger, pre-stamped envelope bearing the address of the voter's Consulate (see diagram).
- d. The pre-stamped envelope should be returned to the Consular Office by post as soon as possible and in any case in time for it to reach the Consular Office no later than 9 June 2005. Any ballot papers received after that date will not be scrutinised and will therefore be destroyed.

PLEASE NOTE

- > NO IDENTIFYING MARK OF ANY KIND SHOULD APPEAR ON THE BALLOT PAPERS, THE SEALED ENVELOPE OR THE COUNTERFOIL
- > BOTH THE SEALED ENVELOPE AND THE BALLOT PAPERS MUST BE WHOLE AND UNDAMAGED
- > THE NAME OF THE SENDER MUST <u>NOT</u> BE WRITTEN ON THE PRE-STAMPED ENVELOPED
- e. Any voters who, by 29 May, have not received the voting pack at their home address, may obtain one by visiting their Consulate **in person** to verify their electoral status and apply for a duplicate pack.
