The global perspective of the Third World Forum of Local Economic Development, attended by the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, the economic world with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Turin Islamic Economic Forum, bilateral meetings with foreign delegations coming from all over the world, the exploration of new markets with the Turin Modest Fashion Roundtable and of new horizons with the Railway Silk Road Cities Forum; The Children's World festival, the Sport in Europe meeting, Torino City of Design, a whole week organized to celebrate the Unesco Creative City of Design designation awarded to our city, the conference on Hanji, the Korean Mulberry Paper as well as the days devoted to foreign traditions and cultures are just a few of the successful events that Torino hosted in 2015.

In addition, throughout the year the City signed important cooperation agreements with Luxor, Bethlehem, Maputo, Nice, Yangon, Gjakova, Ho Chi Minh and Tunis, consolidating cultural and economic cooperation and further strengthening the already existing relations of friendship. Torino has thus confirmed its role as leading exporter of culture and scientific expertise.



Torino has changed. Since its postindustrial conversion and thanks to a common development plan shared by local administrators in the last twenty years, Torino has been able to shape its own future and is now a city open to the world.

Torino is still changing, investing in research, university, knowledge and new technologies. Still being an inclusive city which promotes integration and solidarity.



# **HIGHLIGHTS**

# FOCUS Third World Forum of Local Economic Development

The Forum, hosted in Torino from 13 to 16 October, represented an important opportunity to promote the exchange of practices and strategies on the role of territories in global development processes.

The event, held at the Polo Reale in Torino, was organized by the City of Torino, the Metropolitan City of Torino, the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), the Committee on Local Economic Development, the Andalusian Fund of Municipalities for International Solidarity (FAMSI), the Organization of United Regions (ORU FOGAR), the Brazilian Service of Support for Micro and Small Enterprises (SEBRAE), the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

The highest representatives of the United Nations and the Italian Republic took part in the debate, including Ban Ki-moon, UN Secretary-General, Pietro Grasso, President of the Italian Senate and Paolo Gentiloni, Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs.

With more than 2,000 participants coming from 130 countries, the Forum involved representatives of national and local governments, mayors, associations, entrepreneurs, academics, researchers and members of the civil society.

The Forum conclusions highlighted significant pilot projects, identifying major themes to be developed such as territorial identity and

relationship between rural and urban areas, immigration, social innovation and renewable energies.

#### ► FOCUS Holy Shroud Exhibition

Over two million pilgrims coming from all over the world visited Torino to pay homage to the Holy Shroud, exhibited inside the Cathedral. The exposition ended after 67 days on 24 June, feast of St. John the Baptist, patron saint of Torino.

The most moving moment of this religious and civic event, that involved the whole city, was the pastoral visit of Pope Francis ending with the celebration of the Holy Mass in Piazza Vittorio, attended by over 70,000 people.

#### **▶** Agreements

Along the year the City of Torino extended its network of international relations, signing new agreements with Bethlehem, Gjakova, Ho Chi Minh, Luxor, Maputo, Nice, Tunis and Yangon. Torino has agreements with 46 Cities in the five continents.

### **Torino meets Berlin**

The programme promoted cultural events, projects on music, cinema, arts, live shows as well as workshops and conferences on science, philosophy and German literature, in collaboration with several cultural institutions of the city.

# Terre del Nord Torino Festival

The second edition of this cultural event, unique in Italy, presented the fascinating traditions of Iceland, Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Finland and Estonia through concerts, conferences, exhibitions and workshops.

# General Assembly of the International Association of Educating Cities

The members of the Executive Committee and the General Assembly of IAEC, coming from Spain, Switzerland, Mexico, Portugal, Togo, Colombia, France, Brazil, Argentina and Finland, met at the City Hall to plan the network guidelines. Mariagrazia Pellerino, Deputy Mayor for Education of the City of Torino, took part in the meetings.

19 - 20 March

#### **UN Annual Retreat**

The City of Torino hosted the annual workshop chaired by the UN Secretary-General Ban Kimoon and addressed to senior UN officials. The meeting, organized by the United Nations System Staff College in Torino and with the support of local governments, focused on development, peace, security, justice and human rights, ahead of the milestone year 2015 and beyond.



25 - 28 March

#### **EUROCITIES Culture Forum**

Representatives from about 50 European cities gathered in Torino to talk about the use of public art and cultural heritage by citizens. After the plenary session, in the presence of Mayor Piero Fassino and of Annelies Storms, Deputy Mayor for Culture of Ghent, the participants discussed specific issues through workshops and working groups.

25 - 29 March

### **Biennale Democrazia**

Passages was the main theme of the 4<sup>th</sup> edition, which brought to Torino 128 actors of the Italian and international public debate, with 102 cultural events in 5 days. The subject developed allowed a reflection on social, economic, political and scientific transformations marking our times.

# **Workshops on Burmese lacquers**

In the framework of the UNIDO project Fostering pro-poor and inclusive MSME development in Myanmar, funded by Italy for the development of small and mediumsized enterprises in Myanmar, a series of workshops were held by experts from Bagan. Students and teachers from the European Design Institute and the Academy of Fine Arts in Torino learned the production techniques of Burmese lacquers.

Mayor Fassino opened the conference *Malta - Industrial Investments and Business Opportunities* focused on the investment potentials offered by the Mediterranean island to Italian investors. The event was organized by the Embassy of Malta to Italy and by the Consulate of Malta in Torino.

# The Financier and the Cobbler - Operetta by J. Offenbach

Students of the Conservatory of Chambéry performed at the Casa Teatro Ragazzi e Giovani in Torino the operetta freely adapted from La Fontaine's fairy tale. Luca Cassiani, Chairman of the Culture Commission of the Torino City Council and Nathalie Colin-Cocchi, Deputy Mayor for International Affairs of Chambéry, attended the performance.

# Sun Trip 2015

A group of cyclists from Chambéry arrived in Torino as a preview of the second edition of *Sun Trip 2015*. The intercontinental solar bicycle rally, covering a distance of 7,000 km, crossed 10 countries up to the Turkish regions of Antalya and Cappadocia.



9 June

#### 2015 Electric Marathon

The electric cars of the Kiev - Monte Carlo marathon crossed Torino, regular leg of the race, and stopped over at the Politecnico for recharging. The event, which received the High Patronage of Prince Albert II of Monaco, aimed at increasing awareness on sustainable development, alternative energy sources, new technologies and at encouraging cooperation between different European territories.

10 - 12 June

### 9<sup>th</sup> World Chamber Congress

Torino hosted more than 1,300 delegates coming from over 115 countries. The meeting, held every two years in a different continent, was enlivened by over 150 speakers in 33 sessions. On that occasion, a group made up of representatives of the Chambers of Commerce from all over the world presented the *Charter of guiding principles for the defence of entrepreneurs rights*.

# 2015 Automotive Technology Forum

The City of Torino and MSX International organized at the Automobile National Museum the meeting *Driving Technology: Where Silicon Valley Meets Torino*. The conference resulted in a fruitful exchange with the line-up of world-renowned speakers.

#### Italian-Egyptian Workshop on Bilateral Scientific Cooperation

The Egyptian Museum in Torino hosted the meeting of the National Research Council in order to strengthen cooperation between Italy and Egypt on cultural heritage. Stefania Giannini, Italian Minister for Education, University and Research and Sherif Hammad, Egyptian Minister for Scientific Research, attended the event.

# Forum on Italian - Tunisian Bilateral Relations

Torino hosted the workshop Focus on Italian-Tunisian Bilateral Relations, Development of Economic and Cultural Relations, Opportunities in the Industrial and Tourism Field. The event, aiming at fostering industrial and commercial cooperation projects between the two territories, was organized by the Chamber of Commerce of Torino, in collaboration with the City of Torino, the Embassy of Tunisia to Italy, the Consulate of Tunisia in Genoa, the Piemonte Agency for Investments, Export and Tourism and Sincresia Group.

### **Economic conference on Egypt**

The Academy of Sciences hosted the international conference *Egypt's Economic Reform Agenda. A new Path for Growth* in the presence of the Egyptian Prime Minister and of the Egyptian Minister of Industry, Trade and Small and Medium-sized Enterprises.



The discussion focused on the Egyptian government reforms and on business opportunities for Italian companies.

# Turin Modest Fashion Roundtable

The City Hall hosted the meeting between Italian high level actors in the field of fashion/design and their international Islamic counterparts on the investment opportunities in such a fast-growing sector. The event was organized by the City of Torino, Thomson Reuters and the Dubai Chamber, with the support of the Dubai Islamic Economy Development Centre.


#### The Children's World

The Torino city centre was enlivened by the international show on creativity for children and families, featuring drama, dance, and circus activities, puppets and interactive workshops realized by Italian and foreign companies coming from China, France, Japan, Romania, Spain, Belgium and Russia. The festival was organized by the City of Torino and by Fondazione Teatro Ragazzi e Giovani in collaboration with Fondazione per la Cultura Torino.

2 August

#### Nagoya Day

On the occasion of the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the twinning with Nagoya, the City of Torino and the Fondazione Teatro Ragazzi e Giovani organized a twenty-four hours event totally devoted to the Japanese city. The public



enjoyed the cultural life of Nagoya through performances, calligraphy workshops and origami.

# Sport in Europe: new ways of promoting sport

The City of Torino, in the framework of the *European Week of Sport*, hosted at the Gallery of Modern Art the meeting which gathered more than 20 European cities for an exchange on best practices and actions of sport promotion. The event was moderated by Stefano Gallo, Deputy Mayor for Sport and Leisure, in the presence of Piero Fassino, Mayor of Torino, Antonio Silva Mendes, Director at the Directorate-General of Education and Culture of the European Commission, Giuseppe Zaffuto, Media Officer of the Council of Europe, and Gianfrancesco Lupattelli, President of Aces Europe.

23 - 24 September

### Rickshaw Boy at the Teatro Regio

The 2015 edition of *MITO SettembreMusica* was closed by the European premiere of the Chinese opera *Rickshaw Boy*, adapted from the novel by Lao She, one of the most significant writers of modern Chinese literature. The score has been written by the composer Guo Wenjing, who studied at the Beijing Conservatory of Music.

#### **Monet Exhibition**

The Gallery of Modern Art played host to over 40 masterpieces lent by the Musée d'Orsay in Paris, featuring a magnificent exhibition on the famous painter.

### **Cuba country presentation**

The Torino Incontra Conference Centre hosted the congress *Cuba Revolution - How business and cooperation can foster the change* to present to the local business community the investment opportunities on the Cuban market. The meeting was organized by Torino Chamber of Commerce, AICEC and City of Torino, in collaboration with ITA - Italian Trade Agency and Piemonte Agency for Investments, Export and Tourism.

#### **TIEF 2015**

The second edition of the *Turin Islamic Economic Forum* drew to Torino more than 50 speakers from all over the world for an exchange on three main issues: finance, food and fashion. The event, organized by the City of Torino, the University and the Chamber of Commerce, with the support of ASSAIF, was held at the Campus Einaudi.

### **BJCEM and the Biennale 3.0**

The International Association for the Biennal of Young Artists from Europe and the Mediterranean, with the support of the City of Torino and under the patronage of the

Ministry of Cultural Heritage and Activities and Tourism, organized at the Holden School the international forum *Biennale 3.0* | *30 years* of creative productions, focused on artists mobility and cultural dialogue.

12 - 15 November

#### **Festival of Education**

The Festival Educational Connections. The city as a formative ecosystem, promoted by the City of Torino, devoted a whole day to international case studies, hosting speakers coming from China, Germany, Romania, the United States and the United Kingdom.

27 November

# Railway Silk Road Cities Forum

The first meeting of the forum promoted by MIR Initiative, having as main purpose the creation of a common high-speed railway area within the boundaries of Greater Eurasia, took place at the City Hall. Delegates from Italy, Germany,

Poland, Romania, the Russian Federation and Hungary, in the presence of Mayor Fassino, signed the *Turin Charter* containing the principles and aims of the forum.


# Conference on Korean Mulberry Paper

In 2015 the City of Torino signed eight new agreements with foreign cities, strengthening the bilateral relations already existing, and totalling twinnings, partnerships and cooperation agreements with 46 Cities in 29 countries overall.

On 1 April, on the occasion of the opening ceremony of the renewed Egyptian Museum in Torino, Mayor Fassino and the Vice Governor of **Luxor** signed a Cooperation Pact to foster relations between Italian and Egyptian academics and to promote mutual activities in economic, academic and cultural areas.

On 19 May a Memorandum of Understanding was signed with the City of **Yangon**, supporting the several cooperation activities related to projects on sustainable mobility and urban solid waste management developed between the two municipalities.

On the occasion of the official visit of David Simango, Mayor of **Maputo**, on 26 May the two Cities signed a Cooperation Pact. Torino and Maputo have been partners for some years in the framework of the European project *Jovens contra a Violência de Gênero*, aimed at contrasting discrimination against LGBT people.

During an institutional mission to **Nice**, held at the end of May, Mayor Fassino and Mayor

Estrosi signed a Letter of Intent, to be followed by a Pact aiming to promote mutual activities in the field of culture and tourism.

On 30 June Torino and **Gjakova** signed a Cooperation Agreement focused on activities and exchanges in the academic field with the University and the Politecnico of Torino.

Mayor Fassino and the President of the People's Committee of **Ho Chi Minh**, Le Hoang Quan, signed on 8 September a Cooperation Agreement to foster collaboration in the fields of economy, education, culture and tourism, e-government, urban planning and environment.

Finally, during the *Third World Forum of Local Economic Development*, held in Torino in October, Mayor Fassino received several foreign delegations. In particular, he met the Minister of Palestinian Local Government Hussein Al Araj. On 14 October they signed a Cooperation Agreement between the Municipality of **Bethlehem** and the City of Torino, to support local development in the management of water and trade resources.

On the same day Mayor Fassino met Seifallah Lasram, Mayor of **Tunis** and they signed a Cooperation Agreement aimed at developing economic, cultural and academic relations between the two Cities.

#### **BACAU - Romania**

In 2007 the two Cities signed a Memorandum of Understanding in order to promote urban, social and cultural development and to support initiatives of integration addressed to the large Romanian community in Torino, coming from Bacau.

### **BARCELONA - Spain**

A rich history of academic, cultural and economic relations has been developed between Torino and Barcelona. In October 2005 a Memorandum of Understanding was signed to promote cooperation between the respective city markets, Porta Palazzo and La Boqueria.

#### **Activities in 2015**

- Mayor Fassino attended the First Conference on Metropolitan Governance and Territorial Competitiveness organized by AMB, the Metropolitan Area of Barcelona. During the event Torino was chosen as candidate city for the 2016 edition of the European Metropolitan Authorities Forum.
- Deputy Mayor for Labour, Commerce and Productive Activities Domenico Mangone participated in the final conference of the European project *URBACT Markets* and in the 9<sup>th</sup> International Public Markets Conference, both held in Barcelona.
- Mayor Fassino led a mission to Barcelona to promote the *EXPO-EXTO 2015* programme, with the support of Turismo Torino e Provincia and the Consulate General of Italy.



- Two girls from Barcelona were hosted in Torino for an internship as part of the activities of the XARXA network.
- The City of Barcelona took part in the General Assembly of the IAEC network, held in Torino in March.
- The cultural association Adifolk performed in *The Children's World* festival.
- Deputy Mayor for Development, Innovation, Environment and Green Areas Enzo Lavolta met Jaume Collboni, Vice Mayor of the City of Barcelona and Vice Chairman of Barcelona Metropolitan Area to compare the strategies adopted by both Cities in the field of public systems, on the occasion of his stay in Torino for the *Third World Forum of Local Economic Development*.

# **BETHLEHEM – Palestinian Territories**

On 14 October 2015 a Cooperation Pact was signed to support local development in water management and commerce. The Pact followed a Letter of Intent, signed on 20 May 2015, expressing the will to reinforce cooperation between the two Cities.

#### Activities in 2015

# **BUENOS AIRES - Argentina**

In 2010 the City of Torino and the Government of the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires signed a Cooperation Agreement based on art, culture, tourism and science dissemination. This agreement was renewed in 2013 by extending the areas of cooperation to economic development, mobility and transport.

#### **CAMPO GRANDE - Brazil**

In 2003 a Cooperation Agreement was signed in the academic, cultural, social and economic fields.

#### Activities in 2015


Deputy Mayor for City Planning Stefano Lo Russo received a delegation from Campo Grande and described Torino's best practices on development and urban planning.

#### **CANNES - France**

Cannes and Torino, bound by historical cooperation relations, signed a Friendship Agreement in 2000, seeking to promote common projects on culture, sport and youth.

#### **Activities in 2015**

Mayor Fassino and Deputy Mayor for City Planning Stefano Lo Russo took part in MIPIM, the international exhibition of real estate held in Cannes, to present the investment opportunities offered by the City of Torino.



# **CHAMBÉRY - France**

Torino and Chambéry are bound by an historical twinning signed in 1957. In 2015 the two Cities signed a Letter of Intent to further support the several activities, exchanges and projects carried out every year in different fields.

#### Activities in 2015

- Mayor Piero Fassino welcomed the Mayor of Chambéry, Michel Dantin, and his large delegation of city councillors, on the occasion of the signing of the Letter of Intent between the two Cities.
- The Musée des Beaux Arts of Chambéry hosted the exhibition *Rois et Mécènes. La cour de Savoie et les formes du rococo*, as a result of the cooperation with Palazzo Madama in Torino.
- Students of the Conservatory of Chambéry performed the operetta *The Financier and the Cobbler* by Jacques Offenbach at the Casa del Teatro Ragazzi e Giovani in Torino.
- A group of cyclists from Chambéry, taking part in the preview of the *Sun Trip 2015* race, were welcomed by Deputy Mayor for Development, Innovation, Environment and Green Areas Enzo Lavolta.
- Students of the École de la Deuxième Chance de Savoie visited Piazza dei Mestieri for an exchange on the activities carried out and to discuss possible collaborations.


- Some farmers from Chambéry took part in OrtinFestival, the gastronomic event held in the gardens of the Reggia di Venaria.
- A delegation made up of the Deputy Mayor for Culture and the Deputy Mayor for International Relations of Chambéry was welcomed by Mayor Fassino. Aim of the meeting was the *Luci d'Artista* exhibition and its installations, organized by the City of Torino.
- Domenico Mangone, Deputy Mayor for Labour, Commerce and Productive Activities, inaugurated the *Market of Piedmontese products* organized by the City of Torino in collaboration with Turismo Torino e Provincia, for the first edition of the *Gastronomy Festival* of Chambéry. Afterwards he met in Torino a delegation led by his French counterpart visiting the city for a study visit on the local market system.
- The mutual promotional exchanges through advertisement posters of the two Cities went on.

### **COLOGNE - Germany**

Twinning signed in 1958 to promote the path to European integration.

#### Activities in 2015

Deputy Mayor for Sport and Leisure Stefano Gallo and the City Manager Gianmarco Montanari met the Vice Mayor of Cologne Ralf Heinen visiting Torino for the *Holy Shroud Exhibition* and for the programme of cultural events *Torino meets Berlin*.



### **CÓRDOBA - Argentina**

Córdoba has historical relations with Torino due to Piedmontese emigration. The Twinning Agreement was signed in 1986.

#### Activities in 2015

- ▶ A delegation led by Mayor Ramón Javier Mestre met Vice Mayor Elide Tisi and Deputy Mayor for City Planning Stefano Lo Russo. On that occasion a Letter of Intent was signed to celebrate the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the twinning.
- A group of engineering students came to Torino for the annual study visits focusing on automotive issues.

#### **DETROIT - USA**

The two Cities have been twinned since 1998. The agreement is aimed at strengthening relations by promoting cultural, social and economic exchanges.

# **EKATERINBURG – Russian Federation**

The agreement was signed in 1998 in order to support and develop the cooperation between local management and economic institutions of both Cities.







# ESCH-SUR-ALZETTE – Luxembourg

Twinning signed in 1958 to promote the path to European integration.

#### FEZ - Morocco

The Cooperation Agreement, signed in 2010 and renewed in 2014, deals with heritage protection, e-government, ICT in Local Government and culture.

# **GAZA – Palestinian Territories**

In 1996 the City of Torino committed itself to attempting a twinning with both an Israeli and a Palestinian city. By suggestion of the respective national authorities, Haifa and Gaza were chosen. The Twinning Agreement between Torino and Gaza was signed in 1999.

#### **GJAKOVA - Kosovo**

Cooperation Pact signed in 2015 to promote economic, academic, cultural and e-government cooperation. On the occasion of the signing ceremony of the Pact, Mayor Fassino met a delegation headed by Mimoza Kusari-Lila, Mayor of Gjakova.

#### **Activities in 2015**

The Mayor of Gjakova took part in the *Third World Forum of Local Economic Development.* 



### **GLASGOW - United Kingdom**

Between Glasgow and Torino, twin cities since 2003, exchanges are based on urban renewal, art and culture.

#### Activities in 2015

The City of Glasgow attended the *Sport in Europe* conference held in Torino during the *European Week of Sport*.

#### HAIFA - Israel

In 1996 the City of Torino started a twinning process with both an Israeli and a Palestinian city, and Haifa and Gaza were chosen. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed with Haifa in September 2005.

#### Activities in 2015

Young students from the Tiltan College of Haifa attended the *IAAD Turin Design Workshop* and met delegates of the City of Torino to discuss collaborations on design.

#### **HARBIN - China**

The relations with Torino arose in the industrial field but were also extended to the two municipalities, which signed an agreement in 2003.

#### **HEBRON - Palestinian Territories**

Cooperation Agreement signed in 2013 for the improvement of services in the field of environment, renewable energy, culture, education and vocational training, youth and health policies.

#### **Activities in 2015**

- The City of Torino led a mission connected to the *Hebron Innovation Technopark* project and took part in the *Italy Day* promoted in Hebron by the Consulate General of Italy in Jerusalem.
- A delegation from the City of Hebron, headed by Vice Mayor Jawdi Abusneineh, took part in the *Third World Forum of Local Economic Development*.

#### **HO CHI MINH - Vietnam**

Friendship and Cooperation Agreement signed in September 2015 to foster exchanges in trade, academic, scientific, technological, cultural and environmental areas.

#### **Activities in 2015**

On the occasion of the signing ceremony of the agreement, a delegation led by Le Hoang Quan, Mayor of Ho Chi Minh, and by Cao Chinh Thien, Ambassador of Vietnam in Rome, was welcomed in the City Hall. Moreover, a seminar on business opportunities in Ho Chi Minh was also held.

### **IZMIR – Turkey**

In 2012 a Letter of Intent was signed to start cooperation on cultural, economic, academic and urban development issues.

#### Activities in 2015

A young photographer from Torino represented the City in the Capture Izmir contest.



# LIÈGE - Belgium

Twinning signed in 1958 to promote the path to European integration. The activities focus on youth exchanges in the framework of European projects.

#### **LILLE - France**

Twinning signed in 1958 to promote the path to European integration.

#### Activities in 2015

The Lycée Louis Pasteur of Lille took part in Languages on Scene!, the European student festival of multilingual theatre.

### **LISBON - Portugal**

In 2012 the two Cities signed a Letter of Intent to promote mutual cooperation on economic, academic and cultural issues.

#### Activities in 2015

- Jorge Máximo, Deputy Mayor for Sport of the City of Lisbon, took part in the Sport in Europe conference held in Torino during the European Week of Sport.
- The City of Lisbon took part in the General Assembly of the IAEC network, held in Torino in March.
- A delegation from the City of Lisbon met Mayor Fassino and took part in the opening ceremony of *Paratissima*. The Portuguese capital will host the first edition of *Paratissima Lisboa* in 2016.





### **LUOYANG - China**

In 2013 the two Cities signed a Letter of Intent concerning urban development.

### **LUXOR - Egypt**

Cooperation Pact signed in 2015 between the City of Torino and the Governorate of Luxor to promote mutual activities in economic, academic and cultural areas.

Participation of Torino in the Sister and Friendship Cities Children's Art Exhibition with drawings made by students of the Leone Sinigaglia and Eugenio Montale Primary State Schools and exchange of drawings with schools in Nagoya.

#### **NANTES - France**

In 2013 Nantes and Torino signed a Letter of Intent to promote mutual cooperation on cultural and environmental issues.

#### Activities in 2015


- Ali Rebouh, Deputy Mayor for Sport of the City of Nantes, took part in the Sport in Europe conference held in Torino during the European Week of Sport.

Multisectorial Cooperation Agreement signed in 2009 in Morocco.

#### Activities in 2015

Torino hosted the *First Friendship Festival* between *Torino and Rabat* with a full packed programme of cinema, music, dance, and theatre activities. Ilda Curti, Deputy Mayor for Youth and Integration Policies, attended the opening ceremony of the festival.



# **ROSARIO - Argentina**

In 2011 a Cooperation Protocol was signed, further strengthened in 2013 by a Letter of Intentaimed at supporting mutual cooperation on urban planning and development.

#### Activities in 2015

### **YANGON – Myanmar**



# Santiago de Cuba



Several foreign delegations come every year to Torino, thanks to the various international relations that the City has established and to its cooperation with Consulates and Embassies. The meetings carried out promote a continuous exchange of experiences and are an opportunity to plan and develop cooperation agreements and projects.

In 2015 the City of Torino hosted **74 foreign delegations** coming from **39 countries**. It had the honour to welcome, among several foreign guests, some outstanding personalities: the President of Austria Heinz Fischer, the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, the Minister of Commerce of Myanmar Win Myint and the Prime Minister of the Republic of Belarus Andrei Kobyakov.


As a confirmation of the strong and fruitful relations established with friend and twin cities, Torino hosted on the occasion of institutional meetings Takashi Kawamura, Mayor of Nagoya, Andrey Kosolapov, Mayor of Volgograd, Seifallah Lasram, Mayor of Tunis as well as several representatives coming from the Cities of Barcelona, Belo Horizonte, Campo

Grande, Chambéry, Cologne, Córdoba, Luxor, Saint Petersburg, Shenyang and Yangon.

Moreover, Mayor Fassino met **28 Ambassadors** and Consuls General coming from around the globe, who during their stay in the city planned cooperation activities in the economic, cultural, academic and tourism fields.

In 2015 Torino played host to many internationally renowned events such as the *Third World Forum of Local Economic Development* attended by more than **2,000 participants** coming from **130 countries**. 


In 2015 the City of Torino took part in 25 projects funded by the EU, with a network of partners covering most of the European territory.

The new programming period 2014-2020 gives the opportunity, thanks to several calls, to further develop the themes approached so far.

Projection of documentaries and films related to market places for the third edition of the event *Movies at the Market* held under the Farmers Markets Roof in Porta Palazzo.

# Food Smart Cities for Development

The City of Torino attended the kick-off meeting of the project in Marseille and the assembly on food policies in London.

#### **JCVG**

Bucharest hosted the *Second International Seminar* of the project having the City of Torino as lead partner. Officers and peer educators coming from Italy, Romania and Spain compared the results of the activities carried out in schools and associations and planned the forthcoming working year.

The City of Torino organized the ME+2 video contest addressed to young creatives who produced short films having as main theme violence against women.

#### **NOVELOG**

The Hellenic Institute of Transport (HIT) of Thessaloniki hosted the kick-off meeting involving the European partners of the project. The following meeting, held in The Hague, resulted in the collection of methodologies aimed at a better knowledge of urban logistics services.

#### **PUMAS**

During the final conference of the project, held in Venice, the participants had the opportunity to discuss the results of seven pilot projects on urban mobility involving the Cities of Vienna, Munich, Torino, Venice, Lyon and Nova Gorica and to reflect about the future challenges of mobility strategic planning.

#### **SIforAGE**

The City of Torino hosted the mutual learning seminar and the General Assembly of the project, in the presence of all partners.

#### **SINERGI**

During the Second Thematic Seminar in Lisbon the partners talked about new urban policies for a more inclusive city and about new approaches to increase citizens' awareness and participation.

The City of Torino hosted the Second Thematic Workshop involving the Politecnico of Torino, the Urban Center Metropolitano and the Higher

Institute on Territorial Systems for Innovation, local partners of the project. Students, researchers and public administrators met to discuss the implementation of urban development strategies to promote inclusion at local level.

The project ended with the *Inclusive/Exclusive Cities* scientific conference held in Skopje. On that occasion the Center of Four Cities (C4C) was opened, on the basis of the Urban Center Metropolitano in Torino, as a place where sharing experiences on urban transformation and social inclusion.

#### **SocialCar**

The 26 partners of the project attended the kick-off meeting held in Rome. The City of Torino will test the validity of the new network for smart mobility.

#### **SUMP**

Claudio Lubatti, Deputy Mayor for Mobility and Transport, led a technical mission to Yangon in the framework of the European project that aims to improve urban mobility through the exchange of experiences on transport and road safety policies.

### **SWM in Myanmar**

Two experts of AMIAT travelled to Yangon to carry on technical assistance to officers of the PCCD - Pollution Control and

Cleansing Department, responsible for the urban solid waste management. Moreover ITHACA continued training activities on data management and processing of a predictive model.

The City of Torino welcomed a technical delegation from the Municipality of Yangon who visited the main local plants of waste collection.

Deputy Mayor for Development, Innovation, Environment and Green Areas Enzo Lavolta led a mission to Myanmar for the final conference of the project.

#### **URBACT Markets**

Domenico Mangone, Deputy Mayor for Labour, Commerce and Productive Activities, took part in the final meeting held in Barcelona. The partners of the project also attended the 9<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Public Markets promoted by the US organization Project for Public Spaces.













The International Labour Organization and the Italian Government founded the International Training Centre in Torino in 1964 as an institute of advanced vocational training. In 2014 the City of Torino awarded honorary citizenship to the ILO in the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its activities in town.

capacities and expertise of governments, workers' and employers' organizations and other development actors in the field of labour, social justice and sustainable development. Every year it offers more than 450 programmes and projects to nearly 13,000 people from over 190 countries; from the beginning of its activity until today, more than 220,000 people have been trained at the Centre, in the regions or at a distance. The residential activities are held at the Torino Campus, built in 1961, and consisting of buildings arranged in five groups representing the continents of origin of the participants. The accommodation capacity of the Campus is about 300 rooms.

Since 2010 the Centre has established the Turin School of Development, a partnership with other UN agencies (UNESCO, WIPO, World Bank, UNCITRAL), the University and the Politecnico of Torino to offer postgraduate courses, gathering every year in Torino about 250 participants coming from all over the world.



#### UNSSC **United Nations System Staff** College

The United Nations System Staff College, created by the UN General Assembly in 2002, is a centre of excellence for training and knowledge management within the UN system. Each year, the training initiatives offered by the Staff College including courses, workshops and conferences, reach over 10,000 beneficiaries. The programmes The Centre actively works to strengthen focus on enhancing leadership, negotiation, coordination and management skills needed to effectively serve as an international civil servant, as well as thematic issues spanning the three pillars of the UN's work: peace and security, human rights and development.

> In 2015 the Staff College launched the UN Lab for Organizational Change and Knowledge (UNLOCK), with the support of the Italian Government and other partners. This ambitious renovation project includes training courses, knowledge management and advisory services to support the development of a global and cohesive workforce able to promote change and innovation to achieve the institutional goals that the UN mark in their 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

> In March 2015, the Staff College and the City of Torino hosted the Annual Retreat of the UN Secretary-General: nearly 70 top UN officials gathered in Torino to debate current global world challenges.

#### UNICRI **United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research** Institute

Established in 1967, UNICRI is an independent entity that develops applied research, specialized training and technical cooperation. The Institute, based in Torino since 2000, has offices in eight regions of the world.

UNICRI promotes the rule of law, the culture of legality and human rights. It facilitates the adoption of innovative policies for social development, crime prevention, the reform of the judicial systems and the empowerment of institutions and civil society organizations.

Preventing illicit trafficking and transnational organized crime, promoting assets recovery, mitigating the risks related to the improper use of new technologies and chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear materials, preventing violent extremism, counterfeiting, cyber crimes and crimes against the environment and urban security are among the current priorities UNICRI is addressing. Trafficking in persons, gender-based drug prevention and the improvement of prison systems are also issues addressed by UNICRI's programmes. Moreover great attention is paid to victims of crime, children and young people at risk.

The Institute promotes knowledge and exchange of expertise among countries, local institutions, the scientific community, civil society and the private sector, to enable the creation of platforms for dialogue in addressing common risks and needs, enabling the development of joint actions according to a holistic and multidisciplinary approach.

#### **HYDROAID Water for Development Management Institute**

Not-for-profit association, founded in Torino in 2001, providing vocational training on water resource management for developing and emerging countries. In 2011 it received the recognition of special consultative member of ECOSOC – the UN Economic and Social Affairs Council

#### **UNESCO Centre of Torino**

Founded in 1983, it performs activities aimed at fostering human rights awareness and supporting exchanges among different cultures and generations. It promotes education and training programmes, manages an International Documentation Centre open to the public and coordinates the International Mediterranean Women's Forum and the International Ipazia - UNESCO Centre Women and Science. Researches, Studies and Training for the Mediterranean and the Balkans.

# **UNESCO Chair** in Sustainable Development and Territory Management

Established in 2010 at the University of Torino, it promotes an integrated system of research and training in the field of sustainable development and territory management, facilitating collaboration among researchers and professors coming from all over the world.







### Centro Studi Silvia Santagata-EBLA

Founded in 2008 in Torino, it carries out intensive research and training activities on contemporary political and economic thought and on cultural and creative economy, promoting several events in collaboration with international agencies working in the area.

#### ETF European Training Foundation

The ETF, founded in 1994, is a decentralised agency of the European Union based in Torino. It employs approximately 130 staff and its mission is to help transitional and developing countries to harness the potential of their human capital through the reform of education, training and labour market systems in the context of the EU's external relations policy. The ETF works with 29 partner countries

in North Africa, the Middle East, the Western Balkans and Turkey, Eastern Europe and Central Asia. It provides assistance to partner countries and supports their efforts to make informed policy decisions, implementing policies to enhance the skills of individuals and their economic and social development. In 2015 skills, employability and migration have been priority issues for the ETF. In June 2015 the ETF hosted the international conference *Moving skills forward together* in order to present the latest results of the *Torino Process*, a biennial assessment on the state of skills and vocational education and training systems in partner countries.

Moreover, the ETF attended the *IX World Chambers Congress* in Torino in June 2015, sharing its expertise on entrepreneurial learning and presenting good practices to help young entrepreneurs to start and grow their business activities.



n recent years the City of Torino has deeply increased its cultural offer by promoting a rich calendar of events and becoming a popular and appealing tourist destination drawing a significant number of international visitors. In 2015, on the occasion of the *Universal Exposition*, the City of Torino presented *EXPO-EXTO*, a programme of cultural and sporting events, international conferences and religious initiatives.

The International Book Fair, Cioccolatò, MITO SettembreMusica, Contemporary Art Torino Piemonte, Biennale Democrazia, Torino Spiritualità, Torino Film Festival and Torino Jazz Festival are just a few of the events that drew an ever-growing flow of visitors to Torino. Two new successful music festivals were added in 2015: the Torino Classical Music Festival and Todays, rock music festival for new generations, a real lab of ideas and innovation.

2015 was an amazing year also for the museums of the City, which registered an increasing number of visitors. The **Egyptian Museum**, that reopened on 1 April with an exhibition space of 10,000 square metres, **Palazzo Madama – Civic Museum of Ancient Art**, the **National Cinema Museum** and the **GAM – Gallery of Modern Art** hosted great exhibits such as *Tamara de Lempicka* and *Claude Monet*, just to name a few.



Palazzo Madama - Civic Museum of Ancient Art hosted the Self-portrait of Leonardo da Vinci, one of the most famous expressions of the Renaissance period, exceptionally on display in the Senate Hall on the occasion of the Holy Shroud Exhibition.

The **GAM** - **Gallery of Modern Art** presented the extraordinary *Monet Exhibition* gathering more than 40 masterpieces from the collections of the Musée d'Orsay.

The MAO - Museum of Oriental Art hosted the photography exhibition *The Spice Route. Lands, peoples, conquests*, in partnership with National Geographic Italy. A journey of 73 photographs illustrating the main ports of the sea routes, with their merchants and markets.

On 1 April the **Egyptian Museum** reopened after renovation works with an exhibition space of 10,000 square metres and over 3,300 pieces on show.

- The **Fondazione Merz** presented the exhibit *Christian Boltanski. DOPO*. The French conceptual artist displayed for the first time in Torino a site-specific unpublished project on the social and cultural context of the city.
- The **Pinacoteca Agnelli** displayed *Ed Ruscha: Mixmaster,* drawings, photographs, paintings and objects selected from Torino public collections and connected to the artist's work.



The **National Automobile Museum** hosted the exhibition *MODUS VIVENDI. Travel tales*, a selection of legendary cars that took part in extraordinary journeys.

- The National Cinema Museum presented the exhibit ON THE FRONT. Cameramen and Photographers Recount the Great War, a visual tour with 160 never-before-seen photographs taken by Luis Bogino, following the Royal Italian Army, and soldiers who were also amateur photographers stationed across war zones.
- The 67<sup>th</sup> Prix Italia, international competition for high-quality Radio, TV and Web programmes, focused on the power of storytelling and creativity, with a look at the latest cutting-edge trends.
- ▶ 207 galleries, including 141 foreign ones coming from 35 countries, took part in the 2015 edition of **Artissima 22**, International Fair of Contemporary Art. The 4-day event registered 52,000 visitors.
- ▶ Chaos or Order? was the subject enlivening the 11<sup>th</sup> edition of **Paratissima**. The event was attended by more than 400 emerging artists and creatives, not yet part of the official art circuit.
- ▶ 150 international artists took part in the 2015 edition of **The Others**, the exhibition project dedicated to emerging contemporary art.

- The eighteenth edition of **Luci d'Artista**, the first exhibition in the world bringing light artworks by major international contemporary artists to the squares and streets of a city, was inaugurated by a street parade performed by Torinodanza in collaboration with the Biennale de la Danse de Lyon.
- MITO SettembreMusica, the renowned international music festival, was enthusiastically attended by over 100,000 people in its ninth edition. The 18-day festival was characterized by 303 events 94 of which admission free 98 venues located both in Torino and in Milan, and 2,700 artists coming from 33 countries.
- ▶ 17 titles, 13 operas, 7 new productions, the great dance with the Ballet Nacional de Cuba and a Gala performed by Roberto Bolle and some of the most famous international étoile were just some of the events that characterized the 2015 season of the **Teatro Regio**.
- The **Torinodanza Festival** hosted several international artists such as Sasha Waltz, reigning queen of contemporary dance-theatre.





The **Teatro Stabile**, on the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its foundation, enriched its calendar of events with three world-renowned directors: Declan Donnellan, Meng Jinghui and Christoph Marthaler.

Anthony Braxton opened the fourth edition of the **Torino Jazz Festival**. The artist created for the first time in Europe a stunning eight-hour performance inside the Egyptian Museum, together with 70 musicians. The Festival was enlivened by a line-up of international artists such as Omar Sosa, James Newton, Hugh Masekela, Ron Carter, The Blues Brothers and the Japanese band Shibusa Shirazu.

- The Torino Classical Music Festival gave the audience the opportunity to enjoy some of the greatest composers of all time. Each evening was devoted to a different country: France and Spain, Germany, Russia, Italy, the US and Austria. More than 120,000 people took part in the 6-day festival.
- The Festival delle Colline Torinesi Torino Creazione Contemporanea, in its 20<sup>th</sup> edition, devoted four premieres to Berlin and Germany, including *Villa dolorosa* by the young playwright Rebekka Kricheldorf.
- by 26 international companies coming from 8 different countries that explored the contemporary European scene through a plurality of languages, from dance to circus, from figure theatre to video performance.



- The human mixture. Made of earth, we look at the stars was the main theme of the 11<sup>th</sup> edition of **Torino Spiritualità**: five days of meetings, exchanges, lectures and shows exploring the inner dimension of human beings.
- ▶ The 33<sup>rd</sup> edition of the **Torino Film Festival** confirmed its international vocation hosting films and directors from all over the world. The **TorinoFilmLab**, the international workshop supporting emerging film-makers and involving more than 120 professionals, celebrated its eighth edition.
- ▶ The 16<sup>th</sup> edition of **View Conference**, international event on computer graphics, digital cinema and videogames, was opened by Mark Osborne, multi-awarded director of renowned animated films such as Kung Fu Panda.
- Film Commission Torino Piemonte offered structures, services and incentives to domestic and international film and TV productions, also through its own structure, the Cineporto.





- The first edition of **Todays**, the festival exploring the many different art forms of our times, hosted several artists of the international independent music scene, such as Interpol, TV on The Radio and Ryoji Ikeda.
- Club to Club, international festival of electronic arts and music, welcomed almost 100 artists coming from 10 countries, attracting big names such as Thom Yorke, Apparat and Battles.
- ▶ The fourth edition of **Kappa FuturFestival**, festival of contemporary electronic music and Smart Entertainment, hosted remarkable musicians and performances from all over the world, together with the best from Italy.
- ▶ The **Pala Alpitour** hosted two outstanding events: the U2's *iNNOCENCE+eXPERIENCE Tour* and the only Italian stage of Madonna's *Rebel Heart Tour*.



The Group holds investments in companies based in foreign countries such as Slovenia and Honduras and in 2015 it created the Internationalisation and Innovation Division to promote and evaluate business opportunities abroad. In February 2015 IREN signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Belgrade for cooperation in the field of district heating, waste and public lighting. The Group also started developing relationships with several Chinese companies in order to enhance its know-how on district heating and in September 2015 it signed a Memorandum of Understanding with one of the largest companies in Beijing operating in this field.

In 2015 IREN monitored and participated in consultancy tenders promoted by Multilateral Development Banks. Current geographical areas of interest are the Balkans, in particular Albania. and the former Soviet Union countries such as Kazakhstan.

Since the beginning of 2015 IREN has started relationships with more than 20 countries through meetings, contacts and partnerships with operators and institutions.

In 2015 the Company also became a member of the Chamber of Commerce Italy-Myanmar

through its subsidiary, Amiat, which carries out the environmental health services for the City of Torino.

During 2015, Amiat supported the City of Torino in the SWM2 project, which aims to develop administrative and technical skills for waste management in the City of Yangon.

In 2015 the Group welcomed several delegations, including the Secretary General of Senegal, Diène Faye, the King of Asogli State, Volta Region, Ghana, H.E. Togbe Afede XIV, the Mayor of Belgrade, Siniša Mali and the Mayor of Yangon, Hla Myint.

IREN is also very active in terms of calls for innovation promoted at European level, which are being developed through a network of national and international partners. In particular, in the field of district heating and energy efficiency it is involved in the European projects DIMMER, Flexmeter, CELSIUS, PROBIS and NRG4Cast. As regards user empowering, it is involved in the EMPOWERING project and in the field of electric mobility and onroad charging of vehicles it is partner in the FABRIC project. The BlueSCities, Geosmartcity, SmartWaterTech and TRUST projects are





currently active in the water sector while in includes British and Finnish companies, as the environmental field IREN is part of the BioMethER project. IREN is also involved in the HoliDes project as regards the development of IT platforms and man-machine interaction.

#### **SMAT**

SMAT Group manages the integrated water service of the City of Torino and other 291 municipalities of the Metropolitan City. The company, which has only public shareholders, is national leader in the areas of engineering, construction and management of diversified water sources, drinking water treatment plants, sanitation systems and recycling of urban waste water.

In 2015 SMAT continued its activities at international level. Its Research Centre is lead partner of the consortium preselected in the H2020 – Water 2015 call of the Horizon 2020 programme with the SSW – Sustainable and Smart Water project. It provides the installation of smart meters and flowmeters in the Ouadrilatero Romano district in order to instantly have its water balance and modelling. In the framework of the Horizon 2020 programme, SMAT was a co-applicant in the DEMOSOFC project, funded by the European Union. The project provides for the installation of the first industrial-scale SOFC (Solid Oxide Fuel Cell) plant for the production of electricity from biogas generated by waste water treatment. The result will be clean energy, free from the emissions usually deriving from the endothermic engines. The partnership



well as the Politecnico of Torino.

SMAT also took part in four additional projects within the Horizon 2020 programme, mainly with European partners. It has been selected for funding for the BIOWYSE project, which foresees the development of kits for the instantaneous detection of the biocontamination level of water.

SMAT is the technical partner of the *Bethlehem* Smart Water project, aimed at planning and setting up a remote control system of the water supply network in the Palestinian cities of Bethlehem, Beit Jala and Beit Sahour. The project involves also staff training. It is supported by the *Palestinian Municipalities* Support Program (PMSP), by the Italian Consulate in Jerusalem, by the City of Torino, by Co.Co.Pa. and ATO3.

In 2015 the EU-funded project WATSAM successfully ended. The project, coordinated by Hydroaid, allowed the training of over 150 Ethiopian technicians in the City of Arba Minch on several issues related to water resources management: maintenance. leak detection. setting of rates and network modeling.

Throughout the year several delegations (including Yangon - Myanmar, Jinan - China and St. Petersburg - Russia) visited the headquarters of SMAT and its Research Center.

GTT - Gruppo Torinese Trasporti - is a stock corporation wholly owned by the City of Torino through its subsidiary, FCT Holding Srl. Today



it is the third group of public transport in Italy, with a total staff of about 5,000 employees.

GTT manages an underground automated line, 91 urban and suburban lines (including 8 tram lines), 80 out-of-town bus lines, 2 railway lines and 3 tourist lines, running from Torino and its province to the provinces of Asti, Alessandria and Cuneo, with more than 67 million kilometres covered in 2014.

In October 2015 GTT signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Uijeongbu LRT, a Korean transport company which has been managing since 2012 a similar underground line in the suburbs of Seoul.

In 2015 GTT gave 4 buses to the Union of Moldovan Provinces, according to a programme of international cooperation started in 2014 with a first free supply of 9 buses. All vehicles are used for public transport in Moldova, a country undergoing a dramatic economic crisis.

Furthermore, GTT continued the activities linked to the commercial agreement and promotional exchange signed with SNCF (French railways) in 2012.

5T is the in-house providing company of the City of Torino, GTT - Gruppo Torinese Trasporti, Piedmont Region and Metropolitan City of Torino. It focuses on ITS (Intelligent Transport Systems) solutions for integrated management of private and public mobility, offering expertise and services in the areas of traffic, infomobility, public transport and ticketing.

During 2015 5T enhanced its international



relations hosting a high number of foreign delegations.

In May, 5T welcomed the Mayor of Yangon (Myanmar) to deepen the technological aspects connected to urban mobility integrated management. The visit was organized in the framework of the existing collaboration between Torino and Yangon related to the ongoing cooperation projects. One of the most relevant is the European project SUMP - Sustainable Urban Mobility Planning coordinated by the City of Torino, with the technical support of 5T, CESVI and Ithaca, aiming at transferring experiences and expertise in mobility planning and ITS implementation. In September, the Deputy Mayor for Mobility and Transport of the City of Torino, Claudio Lubatti, headed the first technical mission of the project to Yangon.

5T also received the City of Almaty (Kazakhstan), hosting the 2017 Universiade and candidate city for the 2022 Winter Olympics. In order to tackle the challenges posed by these great events, the Kazakh city recently approved a plan to organize urban mobility, reinforcing public transport services and discouraging private transport through enforcement systems. To this purpose the Limited Traffic Zone system of Torino has been presented together with all the stages connected to design, implementation and management activities.

Equipped with modern infrastructures, the airport serves a high number of destinations, ensuring punctuality, security and comfort. It offers more than 350 weekly scheduled flights, in particular direct connections with 41 scheduled destinations and 25 charter destinations, totalling 23 countries reached SAGAT also continued to collaborate with overall.

Amsterdam, Barcelona, Brussels, Frankfurt, Istanbul, London, Madrid, Monaco, Paris, Rome are among the major European hubs daily connected by Sagat. The connection with Casablanca, inaugurated in October, gives the opportunity to reach not only Morocco but the whole African continent.

The mix of flights operated by traditional airlines and low cost companies ensures a well-balanced offer. Scheduled airlines are Air France, Air Moldova, Alitalia, Blue Air, British Airways, Brussels Airlines, easyJet, KLM, Jet2.com, Iberia, Lufthansa, Meridiana, Monarch, Neos Air, Ryanair, Royal Air Maroc, Tarom, Transavia, Turkish Airlines, Volotea, Vueling, Wizz Air in addition to charter flights serving incoming tourists from Northern Europe during the ski season.

3,666,582 passengers travelled in 2015 through the airport with an increase in traffic of 6.9%. In particular, the number of passengers of

international scheduled flights showed an increase of 15.1%.

connections to Bucharest and Bacau, operated by Blue Air, just a few months after the company inaugurated its only Italian base; flights to Minorca, Split and Alicante with Vueling and to Ibiza with Blue Air during summer; connections to Casablanca with Royal Air Maroc starting from the winter season.

In 2016 new connections to London Luton. Athens, Madrid, Stuttgart, Palma de Mallorca and Minorca with Blue Air and to Lampedusa, Corfu and Skiathos with Volotea will be provided.

In 2015 the Airport experienced a major transformation of its corporate image and was the object of a renewed commercial policy, as demonstrated by the new logo "Torino Airport: connected TO": the pun on the word "TO" aims to underline both the role of the airport and its ties with the territory, using at the same time the English preposition to express the concept of connection.







