Virtuous circles are capillary dissemination and amplification tools for the proposed PRAISE models and methodologies, and these will be studied given this assumption.

Additionally, due to their practical nature, virtuous circles present opportunities for experimentation and involvement in their own right.

In support of this objective, all of the natural resources and mechanisms available to the partnership has been utilised, including: informal networks, official meetings, both internal and with 4 other organizations, including (other) local authorities, electronic networks, and professional representation at conferences, fairs, and other events, both local and international.

The primary domain specific electronic networks, both local and international, has been targeted, in order to start cooperation and engagement with the widest possible group of practitioners.

It is a strategic objective of the PRAISE partners, when possible and appropriate, to present the PRAISE project with posters and demonstrations.

Furthermore, partners have submit papers to specialized national and international journals to disseminate the studied models and methodologies.

All the project meetings are intended as dissemination activities: they consist of one or more days for internal meetings, and another day devoted to an open seminar extended to local institutions; the host partners has informed in advance local authorities and other relevant stakeholders concerning these events.

All of these actions aim at increasing potential communication and feedback, in order to enhance the adopted models, build operative synergies, diffuse a participative attitude and culture, and interlink local experiences, and thereby knowledge, in the sector
